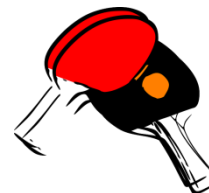

STARTING SCHOOL IN SEPTEMBER 2018

If you have a child born between 1st September 2013 and 31st August 2014 you will need to apply for a reception place through Coventry City Council. Apply online at www.coventry.gov.uk/schooladmissions

The closing date for applications is 15th January 2018.

If you can't apply online, pick up an application form from the school office. You still need to apply even if you have older children already in school.

IMPORTANT HEALTH NOTICE

We have a confirmed case of slapped cheek in school. Slapped cheek syndrome is a viral infection that's most common in children, but it can affect people of any age. It usually causes a bright red rash on the cheeks.

Although the rash can look alarming, slapped cheek syndrome is normally a mild infection that clears up by itself in one to three weeks.

You don't usually need to see your GP if you think you or your child has slapped cheek syndrome, as the condition normally gets better on its own. However, slapped cheek syndrome can be more serious for some people. If you're pregnant, have a blood disorder or a weakened immune system and have been exposed to the virus, you should get medical advice.
